The Role of the Catholic Social Teachings in Caritas Nigeria Humanitarian Interventions

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ABSTRACT

This study investigates the intersection of Catholic Social Teachings (CST) and humanitarian interventions in Nigeria, with a focus on the activities of Caritas Nigeria. CST encompasses a body of doctrine developed by the Catholic Church on matters of social justice, advocating for the protection of human dignity, preferential options for the poor, and the common good. Caritas Nigeria, as an arm of the Catholic Church in Nigeria, translate these teachings into practical action by addressing various forms of human distress and promoting integral human development.

The case study methodology involved an in-depth analysis of Caritas Nigeria's operations within the context of CST. The organization's initiatives in response to emergencies, health crises, poverty alleviation, education, and advocacy were scrutinized. The study found that Caritas

Nigeria's approach is deeply rooted in CST principles such as solidarity, subsidiarity, and stewardship. Through its work, Caritas Nigeria has made significant contributions to fostering peace, reconciliation, and sustainable development in various Nigerian communities.

The effectiveness of Caritas Nigeria's interventions was also assessed against benchmarks set by international humanitarian standards and the social teachings of the Church. This revealed that the organization not only addresses immediate needs but also seeks to tackle structural injustices contributing to suffering. Challenges faced by Caritas Nigeria in undertaking this core mandate include operational constraints, political instability, religious conflicts, and resource limitations.

This study contributes to a deeper understanding of how faith-based organizations can play a pivotal role in humanitarian interventions. It highlights that grounding humanitarian work in CST can enhance the impact of aid efforts by ensuring they are ethically guided and responsive to the holistic needs of individuals and communities.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND THE TEACHING OF PEACE AND SECURITY IN AFRICAN CONTEXT

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ABSTRACT

Christian education and its place in teaching peace and security have an important place in Africa. Africa as a continent has deep religious roots in Christianity. The purpose of this paper is to identify aspects of Christian education that may have a positive influence on the dynamics of conflict or make a contribution to peace building in Africa.

Therefore, this paper seeks to strengthen the need for Christian Education as a measure for conflict prevention and peace building in Africa. This paper looks at the Philosophy of Christian Education, the concepts of peace and security and concludes that the conflict and wars that has been a subject of pain and casualty cannot be won by violence. We need some Christian principles to deal with these incessant conflicts.

Christian Leadership and Integrity: A Tool for Nurturing Values for Good Governance

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ABSTRACT

This paper seeks to analyse Christian leadership and integrity before the latter part of the 20th century and look at same from the latter part of 20th century into the 21st century. It is aimed at bringing out the dichotomy between these two epochs in Christian leadership and how markedly, there has been a considerable departure from the earlier historical accounts of leadership within both the church and society. The latter, according to this paper has seen so much moral deterioration which invariably has affected society negatively. The church is supposed to be the vanguard of ethical behaviour and the torch bearers of moral excellence as posited by Jesus Christ himself (Mt.5:13-16). Leadership on the other hand is so crucial and has a huge responsibility and influence on people in every facet of life and can sway them to do good or evil.

It is therefore incumbent and behooves on the church to consciously and aggressively embark on moral leadership training for its members.
